INTERACTIONS ARE IMPORTANT TO THINK THROUGH BECAUSE

- Not zooming out on the way things connect to one another can lead to myopic thinking
- You can miss important user and business needs by not thinking at this level of granularity about certain aspects of your work
- If you are ever have a need to delegate parts of your execution, thinking through interactions at this level will help you to manage and explain the scope of your requests to others.

IDEAS TO AVOID ANALYSIS PARALYSIS, SENIORITIS AND GENERAL PROCRASTINATION

MAKE A TO DO LIST

Seriously.

Prioritize.

- your tasks
- your scopeyour time
- your resources

Low Priority = This can wait until the last minute and be left out if time doesn't allow

Medium Priority = This would make my work stronger, but if I had to I could live without it.

High Priority = This is seminal to the execution of my work. I cannot say I am done without this.

LEAVE THE BUILDING. GET AWAY FROM ONE ANOTHER. BE ALONE.

NYC has a fabulous set of public libraries. Go to one all alone and work until you meet a goal you set yourself.

PROTECT YOUR TIME.

Practice saying "right now, I am a graduate student in my last semester of thesis so I'll be in touch in May"

TIME BOX YOUR WORK

Especially the parts that you let get away from you...

(i.e Use a timer if you have to, I do this for writing my blog)

TURN OFF YOUR WIFI AND DEVICES FOR A SET PERIOD OF TIME TO WORK

Write a list of things you need the internet to research during that time, it will be an interesting research punch list when you get back online
